






NATIVE SHOES

The first thing we noticed walking into the store was the gigantic living wall, featuring moss foraged sustainably from forest floors located within 50 miles of the shop and lushly surrounding the brand's key message, "Keep it Lite," spelled out in neon tubes. Quickly, though, our attention turned to the footwear itself, with kids' styles stored in candy dispenser-like format and on pegged sheets of birch plywood 'round the back, and adult wares artfully displayed up front beside tryon benches made from (what else?) recycled shoe tiles. High Brow

I USED TO WALK AROUND THINKING I WAS THE ONLY ONE

WITHOUT PERFECT EYEBROWS. NOT SO

While a few lucky plucks out there are naturally gifted in the brow department, most gals (and, it turns out, many guys, too) have achieved model-esque perfection thanks to a technique known as microblading: a form of semi-permanent tattooing that can help virtually anyone achieve eyebrow nirvana. I recently put myself (and my poor, over-plucked '90s brows) in the expert hands of Vancouver-based **B** for Brows esthetician Brenda Ton—and I couldn't be more thrilled with the results.

I was, admittedly, nervous walking up to Ton's Slocan Street studio but, once settled into her pretty-in-pink workspace, felt instantly reassured by her warm, calm demeanour and clear know-how. A certified cosmetic tattoo artist, she's a lifelong lover of beauty who's applied her passion (and penchant for detail) to microblading; in her own words, "I truly believe eyebrows can change your life."

"In my Chinese culture, we say eyebrows will determine if the person is lucky in life or not," she explained to me before we got started. "For that reason many Asian parents want us to have balance and harmony in the brows area. So, I strive to create brows that can bring you good luck.





Many times, believe it or not, I hear great improvements from my clients when they come back for their sixweek touch up, such as meeting a new significant other, getting a new job, receiving new opportunities and an overall increase in happiness. That is amazing news!"

Good luck and good eyebrows?
Sign me up! After asking me a series of questions to discover what result I was after (and having me complete the necessary paperwork), Ton got down to business. Using a special measuring tool, she took careful note of my facial features to determine what would look most natural-slash-appealing and then, with a single-use sterile needle blade, she began to deposit a specially-chosen-for-me colour pigment into the upper layer of my skin using small, careful strokes for a real-hair effect.

Now, I'm not going to lie: it was a bit painful. Fortunately, Ton was



honest and up front about what I might feel during the procedure, so it didn't come as a total shock (she offers pink stress balls to squeeze on, to boot). Soothing music in the background also helped, as did the knowledge that I would soon sit up to see a transformation I'd been wishing to, somehow, some way, experience for years.

Indeed, when Ton was finished and held up a hand mirror, I nearly cried tears of joy: my once razorthin brows appeared naturally full and dark, with perfect proportions and a to-die-for arch. After explaining how to care for my new beauties (and outlining what I could expect to see, healing wise, over the next 10 days), she handed me a care package of soothing coconut-oil-based ointment and sent me on my merry way (as mentioned, I'd be back in six weeks for my touch up), rocking eyebrows I'd only



dared dream of one day possessing. The best part? My new brows will last anywhere from one to three years (Ton's tip: sunscreen, applied directly, can help them linger longer). Candy Crush

FOR OUR FAVE CONFECTIONER, ROSIE O'NEILL,

IT'S ALL ABOUT SWEET LOVE

Get set for a real-deal love story (it's Valentine's Day, after all). Boy takes girl on a "sweet" third movie date, after which an idea is born with a simple question: "Why should kids have all the fun?" And thus **Sugarfina**—a candy store for grownups—was born. Here, the candy queen herself, Rosie O'Neill, talks to us about her very sweet life.

Have you always had a candy obsession?

Yes, it started at a very young age! I was kind of deprived of candy—my mom tried not to have it in the house. I'd secretly buy it and keep it in my backpack, like, all the time. When I was older, I started to travel and discover artisan candies, and that sparked a more sophisticated palate for really high-quality sweets. That was the transition point at which I started to really think about Sugarfina ... but, yes, sugar has basically been a lifelong obsession!

What sparked the idea to launch a high-end candy shop?

The initial thought came about when Josh [Resnick], who's now my husband, took me to see Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory on our third date. After that we started doing research and travelling and meeting with artisan candy makers and it was an eye-opening experience. I had in my head that candy was made in very industrial circumstances, pumped out of a machine with no hands touching it,













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and it was completely the opposite. You have these multi-generational families, with the grandfather and the father and the kids all working in the business together. It's very hands on, with many of these companies using the same recipes they were using in the 1800s. You would be shocked at how much of it is done by hand and how much work goes into creating these candies. There are extremely high-quality ingredients going into it, and the process of making it is very complex. It was really a treat to be able to go behind the scenes and see how they make everything.

In all your travels, did you find a favourite candy?

One was from a candy maker in this tiny little village in Italy. They've been in business since the 1700s and they make a candy called confetti dolei—thin sugar dises that sparkle if you hold them in your hand and turn them this way and that. The flavours are very delicious, from rose water made from blossoms harvested just outside the village to Anisette and orange liqueur—it's a sweet, sparkly sensation and a taste of the Old World in this little bit of bonbon.

Why do you think people are willing to pay more for Sugarfina candy? I'm a big believer that if you're going to indulge and treat yourself then it's worth spending a little bit more to have the best. I think that goes for anything, whether it's wine or chocolate or confections. When you have a choice of something that you should be doing in moderation, why not have the ultimate? I also think that when people are giving gifts, they want to give something really beautiful, that is beautifully wrapped and presented in a way that tells a story, in a way that feels very luxurious. It's all about the feeling you get when you open the box.

How do you choose your highend ingredients and unique collaborations?

We always try to go for what is considered the best. For our Champagne bears we felt **Dom Pérignon** was the absolute best and that's why we chose to use it. In terms of collaborations, I think my favourite lately is with **Casamigos**, George Clooney's tequila brand. We did really fun flavour combos with that, including a paloma sour and these tequila cordials that have a little shot inside. They're very strong and will definitely wake you up, but they're really, really good!

What are some of your favourite candy occasions throughout the year? Valentine's Day, definitely, is a great opportunity to give gifts both to your sweetheart and to all the people in your life that are special to you. I love the idea of surprising your best friend with a sweet treat. With Valentine's Day we get to play with pinks and reds and hearts and foil, and it's just a fun product line to design.

What's new for Valentine's Day 2018?

We released our Whispering Angel rosé wine gummy bears last year and those were insanely successful—they had a wait list of more than 18,000 people—so this year we played on that by creating rosé gummies that look like little rose buds. It's a twist on sending a bouquet of flowers—send rosé-infused roses instead!

Wait lists for candy—does that surprise you?

The same thing happened with our Press Juicery collab—the green-juice gummy bears sold out in three days. I think it speaks to the fact that people really like to be surprised with something unexpected and fun, and something that is socially sharable. That really helps ignite a fire. The second that one person is posting about his or her rosé-infused gummy bears, 50 people are like, "Oh my goodness, I need to have that!"

SOUS VIDE EGG BITES

Just when we thought our beloved coffee brand couldn't elevate its healthy options further, say hello to **Starbucks**' new high-protein sous vide egg bites with taste and texture that's off-the-charts egg-cellent (sorry). Cooked from cage-free eggs using the French technique (i.e., vacuum sealed and immersed in water and cooked at a precise temperature), there are two options to choose from: egg white and roasted red pepper (at just 170 calories and 13 grams of protein) and, for those counting their ketos, bacon and Gruyère bites with Monterey Jack cheese and applewood-smoked bacon (a serving of two for just over 300 calories and 19 grams of protein). Available all day, these beautiful bites make an egg-citing (again, sorry) addition to the menu. *Starbucks.ca* AUREA DEMPSEY

THE VICTOR

The very last of five restaurants to debut at downtown's newsest luxury entertainment centre, the Parq, this place was worth the wait. Inspired by the Queen Victoria era, this high-end North American steakhouse boasts House of Commons-style green leather benches, dramatic "bleeding" bee wallpaper and a her-royal-highness-worthy 360-degree view of False Creek that resto developer Elizabeth Blau and her team spent years perfecting. Among the dishes we tried and loved: a 45-ounce tomahawk steak, Nobu-modelled rock shrimp tempura and a side of mac-and-cheese waffles inspired by an online listicle (thank you, Internet!). WILDTALE


Olympic Villagers have a chic new inthe-'hood dining option thanks to the opening of WildTale's second Vancouver location. With a motif inspired by the legendary chop houses of Chicago and San Fran, the bar-centric space features rich mahogany, honeycomb mosaic, pressed tin and fishing net-adorned lighting in a nod to all things nautical (the eatery's name, in fact, pays homage to the elaborate chronicles of fishermen returning from sea). Nestle into a luxe



Only a five-hour drive from Vancouver and less than an hour from Kelowna, Vernon, snugly nestled within hilly terrain and surrounded by three lakes, makes for an idyllic hideaway. Pile your crew into a luxe **Buick** Enclave (trust us: the 4G LTE Wi-Fi will be your lifeline up in the mountains while the air ionizer will sweep out dust, pollen and contaminants in the air so you can freely breathe in that fresh Okanagan O₂) and head for hills.

With more than 3.5 million Swarovski crystals adorning the property, Sparkling Hill Resort well earns its name. Started by the patriarch of the Swarovski family, this wellness retreat is perched on granite bluffs overlooking Lake Okanagan, serving up views so stunning, it's disputable what's more beautiful—the multitude of gems or Mother Nature herself. The spacious open-concept suites feature twinkling crystal "stars" in the ceiling and gem-shaped bathtubs, so you can bubble bath while soaking up stellar mountain views from the floorto-ceiling windows. Steam and sauna lovers, KurSpa at Sparkling Hill is your Mecca; this stunning oasis boasts seven themed steam and sauna rooms with tips on how long to enjoy each precisely heated space. The remainder of the 40,000-square-foot spa is composed of an outdoor and indoor saltwater pool (complete with underwater music), a hot pool, blissfully quiet lounges and a Kneipp hydrotherapy pathway featuring a series of coldand hot-water sections designed to stimulate circulation and promote relaxation. And, of course, there are treatment rooms to escape to for a signature treatment, such as a stressrelieving "mud and muscle" offering.











SAVOUR

Chances are you'll be too blissed out from the spa to venture out for dinner. With Peakfine Restaurant located at Sparkling Hill, you can stay right put. With a focus on fresh local fare, the menu has fine options for everyone, from soy-roasted black cod to the sweet chilli pad thai for the vegetarians, in a comfortably sophisticated dining room. Sugar fiends, at Sandrine in Kelowna, with the fields of grapevines surrounding you and one of her exquisite French pastries in hand (think macarons, mille feuille, croissants and gourmet chocolates), you'll feel as though you've escaped to Bordeaux—and then the realization you're cosy in your very own home-and-native-land will make dessert seem even sweeter.

SIP

No trip to the Okanagan is complete without some wine tastings; it is, after all, the province's top grape-growing region. Alternate days being the designated driver of your Enclave and swirl, smell and sip to your heart's content when you're not holding the car keys. Stop into Tantalus Vineyards to try some single-vineyard wines (the brightness of the crisp Old Vines Riesling Brut won us over) and stay to take in the Okanagan vistas.

SNOWSHOE

Get your endorphins flowing (and work off some of that Okanagan food and wine) by taking advantage of the landscape. DONKEY & GOAT

The love story behind Jared and Tracey Brandt is emblazoned in the name of their Mendocino winery, Donkey & Goat. In France, donkeys are used for vineyard management but, to counteract their capricious nature, they are each paired with a goat to keep them in check.
